Medicaid Expansion

Funding to implement voter-approved Medicaid expansion was not included in the Fiscal Year 2022 budget. However, Sen. Lincoln Hough and Reps. Crystal Quade and Betsy Fogle provided key support for the appropriation of these funds.

Springfield Transient Guest Tax

Although this priority did not make it across the finish line, Sen. Lincoln Hough and Rep. Craig Fishel have sponsored a bill to enable Springfield voters to consider a transient guest tax to support tourism efforts for the past two years.
